

THE APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Students can collect an application form at our open evening or download a form from our website, which can be emailed to linesj@rugbyhighschool.co.uk as an alternative to posting.

- We will not process any applications before our open evening on 27th January.
- The strict deadline for applications is 4pm on Friday 26th February.
- During March we will write to you inviting you to spend an afternoon here which will include a meeting to discuss your choice of subjects.
- You will receive a conditional offer or a place on our waiting list in May.
- On GCSE results day, you should bring your results into school and confirm your place here. If you decide to take up a place elsewhere please let us know.

On the application form please choose one subject from each of the four option blocks, also complete the order of preference for your choice of subjects. Depending on the number of applicants we should be able to accommodate you. **Remember you can only choose one subject at Lawrence Sheriff School that is not offered at Rugby High School.**

CHANGING SUBJECTS IN SEPTEMBER WILL BE VERY DIFFICULT SO PLEASE CHOOSE CAREFULLY ON YOUR APPLICATION.

INDUCTION INTO THE SIXTH FORM

- During March you will have a short, informal meeting in which we will discuss with you your choice of subjects, and match you with Yr12 guides to talk to you and show you around the school on an ordinary working day.
- You will be invited to an **Induction afternoon in late June** after your GCSE exams. You will have lunch, meet other members of your tutor group and your form tutor, and will do some fun activities designed to welcome you to the school and make you feel at home.
- Further induction will take place on the first day of the autumn term, in which you will hear more about your curriculum, and meet the members of the Sixth Form Committee. We'll run an icebreaker afternoon in the first few weeks of Year 12.
- More activities are organised during the PSE sessions through the year.
- We value our students and aim to make everyone feel welcome and involved in the sixth form. Half of our students join us from other schools in Year 12 and we welcome them warmly.
